In order to use LGfL USO logins, a school will first need to ensure that the headteacher has approved the "data release self-determination" declaration. For more information, click [here](#).

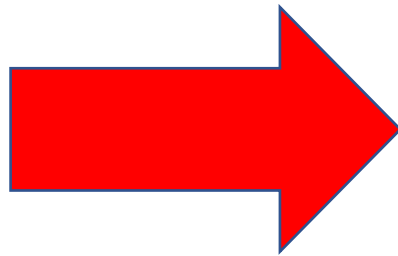
Advice for teachers
